Basic Law Enforcement Training Academy Certificate (Police Academy)

The Colorado Peace Officer's Standards and Training (POST) Board certifies the CCA Basic Law Enforcement Training Academy. Individuals desiring this POST course of study must file an application with the Academy Director before registering. Colorado state law requires that students meet specific guidelines prior to admission.

Those seeking to enter the CCA POST approved Police Academy to be trained and receive state POST certification to be police officers must qualify to enter the Academy.
