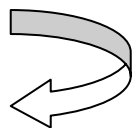

IMPORTANT TRANSFER INFORMATION

A Colorado community college student who is planning to become an early childhood educator will sign a graduation plan at the community college that identifies the first 54 hours (listed above) that are guaranteed to transfer to all teacher education programs at the following Colorado public four-year colleges: Adams State College, Colorado State University (Human Development), Fort Lewis College, Mesa State College, Metropolitan State College of Denver (Human Development), University of Northern Colorado (Interdisciplinary Studies).

To complete the AA graduation requirements, students who have completed or are currently enrolled in courses that will total the first 54 credits will apply to a specific early childhood education program and be advised on the final 6 credits guaranteed to transfer. Students who do not plan to transfer immediately may participate in the co-enrollment and are entitled to the same transfer benefits when they apply for admission in the future. ***This agreement is pending approval.*** Contact Linda Forrest at 303-340-7078 for more information.
