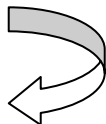

IMPORTANT TRANSFER INFORMATION

After starting your path of higher education at any public college or university in Colorado, and upon acceptance to another, you can transfer up to 35-37 credits of previously and successfully (C- or better) completed guaranteed transfer coursework. These courses will automatically transfer with you and continue to count toward your general education core for any liberal arts or science associate or bachelor's degree program.

In addition, degree electives may transfer as well, depending on the institution of transfer and your intended major. It is important that you consult an advisor and the transfer institution when choosing degree electives, as certain majors have particular degree prerequisites that need to be taken within associate degree requirements. SCHEDULING SUGGESTIONS

1. Register for your assessment or ACT placement recommended classes the first semester.
2. Take English classes early in your program. They'll help you with all of your other classes!
3. See your advisor about balancing your workload with credit load.
4. If you want to graduate in two years, take a minimum of fifteen college-level credits per semester.
5. Transfer and financial aid students should consult an advisor before registering.

ONLINE AND HYBRID CLASSES

___ **Assessment** – All new students must be assessed. Student may be exempt if they provide documentation of appropriate ACT/SAT scores taken within the last 5 years, completion of college-level English and math courses with a grade of 'C' or higher, or completion of an Associate of Arts or Science degree or higher. Students pursuing a computer or real estate certificate or certificates of recognition may be waived from assessment.
