IMPORTANT TRANSFER INFORMATION

The four-year college or university will accept all eligible credits earned within ten years of transfer. Courses earned more than ten years earlier will be evaluated on an individual basis. Colorado community college students who have completed the degree requirements for an Associate of Arts (AA) degree with an emphasis in Business and earned a 'C' or better in all courses shall be fully considered for admission into the business programs offered by the participating four-year public colleges. This agreement does not guarantee admission to the School of Business. However, it does guarantee that admitted students who follow the conditions of this agreement will be guaranteed complete transfer of the AA degree up to the maximum allowable course credits.

This agreement is between the Colorado Public Community/Junior Colleges and Adams State College, Colorado State University, Colorado State University at Pueblo, Fort Lewis College, Mesa State College, Metropolitan State College of Denver, University of Colorado at Boulder, University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, University of Colorado at Denver, University of Northern Colorado, and Western State College. The MCB at UNC won the 2004 Malcolm Baldrige award for quality and is the only business college nationally to win the award and is offering a transfer student a \$1500 scholarship.
