Police Academy Information

Students desiring to apply their Law Enforcement Basic Training Academy credits toward an AAS degree must consult with the Public Safety/Criminal Justice Department staff before enrolling in any CRJ degree program. Background checks are conducted on all applicants for the Academy. NO one convicted of a felony, certain misdemeanors, any crime involving violence against another person, or who has used illegal drugs in the past two years will be accepted. Other conditions apply call 303 340-7215 for more information.

TRANSFER INFORMATION

This A.A.S. degree prepares students for entry-level employment in law enforcement in Colorado. It also will assist those currently in law enforcement in upgrading their skills and résumé. Many, if not most, of the core and elective CRJ courses will transfer depending on the bachelor's program and 4-year college you wish to transfer to. For information on transferability to Bachelor of Science/Arts programs and locations, please contact the Program Coordinator or the Chair for more information and applicable colleges.

Working in the law enforcement or criminal justice field demands individuals of high character and ability. If you are considering a career in the criminal justice field, please note that, by law, those with prior felony, and certain misdemeanor convictions, including those involving theft, moral turpitude, domestic violence and other crimes against persons, cannot apply for law

enforcement positions or the academy, but may be eligible to work in the fields of counseling, mediation, private security, and other legal fields under certain conditions.

Police Academy information:

For information about applying to the Police Academy to get your P.O.S.T. certification to become a police officer in Colorado, contact the academy Program Assistant at 303-340-7215.

Restrictions to applying to the Law Enforcement Academy: Those seeking to enter the CCA P.O.S.T. approved Police Academy to be trained and receive state P.O.S.T. certification to seek positions as law enforcement officers are required and expected to be morally, physically, and emotionally suitable to be hired from the day they enter the academy. Therefore, to ensure that cadets are of the highest caliber, those students wishing to apply for the CCA Basic Law Enforcement (Police) Training Academy will have to meet the following minimum qualifications: **YOU...**

1. **CANNOT** have a felony conviction or certain misdemeanors including those involving theft, moral turpitude, domestic violence and other crimes against persons.
2. **WILL** have an extensive background check conducted, and will have to pass an oral board interview prior to admittance into the academy.
3. **CANNOT** have been convicted of a DUI/DWAI offense in the past five years, have three or more moving violations in the past two years, or a total of five or more moving violations in the past five years.
4. **CANNOT** have used marijuana within the past three years.
5. **CANNOT** have EVER sold, manufactured, or transported for hire, ANY illegal drugs. ALL other illegally used (used when not under care by a physician who gave a legal prescription to you for use) narcotic, depressant, stimulant, hallucinogen, or steroid drugs require a 5-year waiting period.
6. **MUST** pass the Accuplacer assessment test with a score of 84 or higher on the written and reading portions, or show similar proof by a transcript of relevant completed college courses with a "C" grade or higher.
7. **MUST** be in good physical condition, and pass a medical exam, with no limitations, pre-existing injuries, or physical or emotional conditions that may be aggravated by the physical and high stress demands of the academy training; and not currently be on medication that will cause safety concerns during driving, firearms, or arrest control instruction.
8. **MUST** be at least 21 years of age by the completion date of the academy. Certain other conditions apply.

Academic Standards of Progress

CCA defines satisfactory academic progress as maintaining a 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) or higher. In order to remain in good standing at CCA, students must maintain at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA. Students who have less than a 2.0 cumulative GPA will be placed on probation or suspension status. Important Course Information – Refund & Withdraw Deadlines

Each course has a Refund Date & Withdraw Date that students must follow. Depending on the length of your course, the Refund Date deadline could be as early as the first week of class.

Refund Date: Last day to officially drop a regularly scheduled class on the Web or in person (only at Enrollment Services or Lowry 1-Stop) and qualify for a tuition refund. This date varies with class start and end dates. The refund date is the final date to make changes to your schedule without financial & COF charges. (Your COF account will be deducted and you will be charged tuition for any class dropped after this date.) ! Deadlines for your specific course are available from the Enrollment Services Office or your instructor.

Withdraw Date: Last day to officially withdraw from a class and receive a "W" grade (no refund). **Non-attendance without an official withdrawal will result in a failing grade.**
