

# Transfer Information for Private Colleges and Universities

## 2003-04

Although the Associate of Arts and the Associate of Science degree programs are designed to meet the general education requirements at public Colorado colleges and universities, these degrees also work well for transfer into private institutions; however, other degree requirements may exist. It is best to work with an admissions representative from your intended transfer institution early to make your transfer process smooth. While private colleges and universities are usually more expensive than public institutions, they often have scholarship programs, accept a larger number of transfer credits, and credit for prior learning opportunities. Many schools also have accelerated programs to help adult learners earn a degree more quickly.

### **Capella University - (Online programs)**

Capella University offers online degrees that fit your schedule and advance your career in technology, business, education, psychology, or human services. Capella University accepts up to 92 credits from CCA and waives the application fee for CCA students. ### **Columbia College – (Aurora)**

Columbia College is located a mile from CCA on 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue & Sable Blvd, and is a satellite campus of their main campus in Missouri, founded in 1851. Columbia College accepts 81 credits from CCA and the AA or AS degree fulfill their general education requirements. They offer programs in business administration, criminal justice (also available online), computer information systems, and general studies.
