

IMPORTANT TRANSFER INFORMATION

While you have started off at one of Colorado's public colleges or universities, there is a strong possibility you may end up transferring to another institution along the way. To help eliminate the guesswork of transferring general education course credits, Colorado has developed a statewide guaranteed transfer (gt) program. Both the Associate of Arts and the Associate of Science degree programs are designed to meet the statewide guaranteed transfer requirements.

gt Pathways applies to all Colorado public institutions of higher education. After starting your path of higher education at any public college or university in Colorado, and upon acceptance to another, you can transfer up to 35-37 credits of previously and successfully (C- or better) completed gt education coursework. These courses will automatically transfer with you and continue to count toward your general education core for an applicable liberal arts or science associate or bachelor's degree program (a list of applicable majors can be found under the transfer link at the CCHE website at www.state.co.us/cche). In addition, degree electives may transfer as well depending on the institution of transfer and your intended major. It is important that you consult your advisor and the transfer institution when choosing degree electives. Certain majors require that certain electives be taken as part of your associate degree program. Remember, however, that while gt courses are guaranteed to transfer, admission to a four-year college or university is not.

Please note that statewide articulation agreements exist for the following professional degree programs and prescribe specific general education course and degree requirements: business; early childhood education; elementary education; engineering; and nursing.

Adams State College (Alamosa)

Colorado School of Mines (Golden)

Students may want to transfer early and keep contact with a CSM advisor during their studies at CCA. Colorado State University (Fort Collins)

Students intending to transfer should contact a Community College of Aurora advisor to assist them in selecting recommended electives for your intended major. If you are planning to transfer to CSU prior to receiving a degree from CCA, ENG 122 and MAT 121 (or MAT 106 with a grade of 'B' or better) must be completed for transfer admission. Colorado State University at Pueblo (Pueblo)

University of Colorado at Boulder (Boulder)

CU-Boulder offers a wide range of programs in architecture, arts and sciences, business, education, engineering, journalism, and music. Students who plan to major in engineering, architecture, or music must complete the second level of a foreign language in high school or college. All other students are required to complete the third level of foreign language. Students intending to transfer should contact a Community College of Aurora advisor and a University of Colorado representative to assist in developing a transfer program and in selecting recommended electives for their major. Students intending to major in engineering or architecture should plan on transferring early, as many of the required courses for these majors are specific to CU-Boulder.
